FAROF-MNCH's key objective is to provide HCT to 112, 407 of pregnant women that attends ANC and improve access to maternal, newborn and child health in the 12 Local Government areas in Kaduna State.Nigeria.

Kaduna State-MNCH Project enable FAROF work in 2 LGA, namely: Birnin Gwari LGA and Kagarko LGA.

FAROF implement project with the Collaboration of stake holders, UNICEF, KADSACA, Ministry of health and the state Government.



PROJECT OBJECTIVE

1. To assess the level of preparedness of the HCT integration into the MNCHW
2. To identify gaps, and agree on ways of addressing the gaps
3. To, based on realities on ground, finalize the State target of testing 152,407 pregnant women for HIV
4. To finalize the roles and responsibilities of government and its partners during the HCT-MNACHW
5. To finalize pre-implementation activity schedule within the 5-day grace given.

Data Analysis for Kaduna state, Nigeria in twelve LGAs

217,000,	84,035	290

84,035 pregnant women tested within 5days across 12 LGAs which was commended by UN AIDs group as Kaduna state was awarded the best performing state with a letter of award to state governor and the sum of \$14,000 to support demand creation for the 2nd phase of the MNCHW.

The total number of pregnant women across 12 LGAs were 217,000, 84,035 were tested which represent 40% of pregnant women in the state at that time, 290 pregnant women were tested positive and were all linked to PMTCT site. paediatric testing was carried out at baraduko special hospital and general hospital kawo and the target was 1000 most vulnerable children under 5years who are either malnourished or inpatient in these hospitals but were able to reach 617 which is 62% but none was found positive.

Due to the success recorded Kaduna and River state have been selected to pilot the vision of president MuhammedBuhari of elimination of Mother To Child Transmission in 2017.



FAROF-MNCH is focused on four outputs:

1. Strengthening state and Local Government Area governance of primary health care systems geared to routine immunisation and MNCH
2. Improving human resource policies and practices for PHC
3. Improving information and Increasing demand for MNCH services
4. Improving capacity at State Ministry level to enable states' MNCH activities

Nutrition is crucial and far too many children are still hungry. In over 29 states in Nigeria, Children suffer malnutrition, Almost half of all child deaths are attributable to undernutrition

FAROF covers only one (1) LGA in Kaduna state out of 23 LGAs, reason was limited funding on this project
